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Dear Parents/Carers,

We have been focusing this week during assemblies on one of our learning behaviours – perseverance. KS1 looked at lots of funny animal videos with me on Monday in which the cat or panda didn't give up on their goal (even if this was getting a huge stick across a bridge!). I have seen plenty of practical examples of children applying this during some visits to class, whether it be learning a tricky new sound or persevering with their writing when things are tricky.

As it is the start of a new year, please can both you and your child try and have a refreshed focus on ideally both reading and home learning, but especially reading. It is so important for children to get daily opportunities to practise and apply the skills they have learnt in school. This increases their fluency and confidence – also improving their chances of accessing other areas of the curriculum.

Can I also take this opportunity to remind you of the school uniform requirements. In this weather children should always have a coat in school with them for playtimes and lunchtimes. Although jumpers and cardigans do not show our school logo, they should be red. PE kit should be a PLAIN red or black tracksuit with a PLAIN white t shirt – these should not include big logos of computer games or disney characters. If your working circumstances have recently changed and you are now in receipt of universal credit or any other benefits then please let Mrs O'Malley in the office know as she can check whether we may be able to access additional funding in school for your child.
